Communication Barriers




By creating a structured yet flexible communication framework, HR can help remote teams stay aligned and connected.

Remote teams rely heavily on technology to collaborate effectively, and HR must ensure they have access to the right tools such as platforms like are tools such as:


Project management	Asana, Trello, or Monday.com - essential for tracking tasks, deadlines, and progress.

HR needs to provide training on these tools to ensure employees can use them efficiently.




Focus on Outcomes, Not Activities
